Letters in {curly brackets} are used in discussions of Croatian phonology and poetics. Letters in [square brackets] Dž Dž ðž, Lj lj lj, Nj Nj nj, G g, and K K are often used to transliterate the Serbian and Macedonian letters S s, U u, Ђ т, Ѓ у, Ђ у, and K K. (Dz does not have its own place in the alphabetical order and so does not appear in the repertoire above.)
