The Moldavian language is the same language as Romanian but was written in Cyrillic until 1991.

Quotation marks: „single”, „double”

Note that Romanian uses the characters S WITH COMMA BELOW and T WITH COMMA BELOW. In inferior Romanian typography, the glyphs for these characters are sometimes drawn with CEDILLAs, but it is strongly recommended to avoid this practice.
